






Hurricanes Class

In **English** lessons we have been enjoying reading and learning about the plot of our new class text **'The Day the Crayons Quit'**. It has sparked many class discussions about emotions and understanding empathy. The children thoroughly enjoyed taking part in **'hot seating'** and taking on the role of the different crayons while the other children asked them questions.







In **Mathematics** this week, we have been learning about number fact families. We have been writing addition and subtraction number sentences to show how these number facts are related.

In **Computing**, we've been engaging with the world of **Bee-Bots**. The children are developing basic **coding skills** in a hands-on way. We have been learning how to give the Bee-Bots instructions to move forward, backward, and turn, building an understanding of sequencing and problem-solving. It's been exciting to see their critical thinking skills developing as they explore the basics of programming while having a lot of fun with these interactive robots.





Spitfires Class

In Nursery, our topic is all about 'Growing' and we have been exploring this theme in a variety of engaging ways.

We've been reading some lovely books, including **The Tiny Seed by Eric Carle** and **Jasper's Beanstalk by Nick Butterworth**. These stories have sparked curiosity as we learn about how things grow. To bring this theme to life, we've planted our own broad bean plant in Nursery and started growing cress seeds. The children are really enjoying watching their plants grow and observing the changes!

As the weather has warmed up, we've taken our learning outside. In our **mud kitchen**, the children have been experimenting with **herbs** and **plants**, combining nature with creativity. It's a wonderful way to connect with the natural world!



In **Maths**, we have been focusing on counting and exploring 1:1 correspondence with numbers **1-4**, helping children develop a strong number sense through hands-on activities.

In **Phonics**, the children have been learning the sounds 's' and 'a', and we've also started reading a new big book in our sessions, reinforcing the importance of early reading skills.

We have also been learning about yearly events such as **Ramadan** and **Lent**. The children had a great time celebrating **Shrove Tuesday** by making pancakes and exploring the traditions around it.

As always, we are guided by the children's interests, and recently, there has been a big fascination with **Superheroes**! The children have also shown a deep interest in the natural world, with lots of exploration around insects and nature. To support this, we've set up a nature tuff spot where the children have been investigating bugs and learning more about the environment around us.





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We are also incredibly thankful for our wonderful parents, and this week has been extra special as one of our parents led a lovely story session for **World Book Day** as well as parents visiting for the **Reading Breakfast**. It was fantastic to see both children and adults actively participating in the celebration of reading.

Some useful information for you all:

- If you are applying for the working entitlement expanded/extended hours of up to 30 hours funding for the Summer Term, the deadline for this is **31st March 2025**.
- Don't forget to reconfirm your details with HMRC if you have 30 funded hours when required. You should receive emails to prompt you to do this.

- If you have any plastic bottles, we would be happy to receive them to make seed shakers with the children.






