News from our classrooms

Blackbirds

Firstly, a huge **congratulations** to all the children for their amazing performance during our recent class assembly. They worked so hard to prepare, sharing their learning with enthusiasm and confidence. Despite some initial nerves at the beginning, they demonstrated the Marleigh values of Resilience and Reaching High and pushed through to deliver a brilliant assembly. We were so proud of them, and we can imagine you were too!

In **DT** we've just wrapped up our **pneumatic device project**, which allowed the children to design and build models that use air pressure to create movement. From moving arms to shooting rockets, their inventions were extremely imaginative. Despite some of the projects not performing as expected, they learned all about the process of trial and error, which they took on board bravely!

This week, we are going to evaluate how well they work and think about what we might do differently next time—a key part of our learning process.

In **Maths**, we've been concentrating on mastering our times tables, and it's wonderful to see their confidence growing. Many children are beginning to tackle their recall with speed and accuracy. We have been looking at the connections between the times tables and how this can help support us in our learning.

In **RE**, we've been learning more about **Islam** and the importance of **prayer**. A special thank you to the children who shared their own experiences of how they pray —it was inspiring to see them become teachers themselves and help us all understand the meaning behind their practices.

We have had an excellent few weeks in Blackbird class with confidence growing weekly. We are looking forward to the next couple of weeks and enjoying getting in the festive spirit!



Hurricanes

Hurricane class have been enjoying using the new **climbing wall** at lunchtime and breaktime.

They have been learning to build **electrical circuits** in **Science** and have looked at **symmetry** while making **Christmas crafts**.









Comets

On Monday Comet Class were talking and made a **Christingle**. Christingles are used at **Advent** services and the person leading a service usually gives all the children a candle with a red ribbon around it as a symbol of this. In **1968**, the **Children's Society charity** used the idea of the Christingle and made their own version:



- Red ribbon goes around the middle of the orange.
- Sticks are pushed in around the edge of the orange.
- Sweets are put onto the top of each of the cocktail sticks.
- The candle is pushed into the top of the orange.


Christingles are often used during Advent in Christingle services. Thoughts are expressed for people in need are said and songs are sung. During the service, the candles on the Christingles are lit and all the lights are turned off.

Final Details for the Pantomime Trip

The whole school is very excited about our trip to the <u>pantomime</u> on **Wednesday**, **18th Dec**. Here are the final details you need to ensure the trip runs as smoothly as possible:

- Children must wear appropriate school uniform and a warm coat as we have a short 5
 minute walk from the coach drop off point to Cambridge Arts Theatre
- Please provide your child with a small, healthy snack which can go in their coat pocket
 and be eaten during the interval, a reminder no nuts or sweets please. Your child will
 also need a small water bottle which is clearly labelled with their name, for them to
 carry on the day. Cambridge Arts Theatre operates a strict bag policy so children are
 not able to take a bag into the theatre.
- Please ensure your child brings a packed lunch to have at school when we return from the pantomime unless you have already arranged with the school for one to be provided.
- Please make sure you have signed the <u>permission slip</u> for your child otherwise they will be unable to attend.
- It would be lovely if you could share one or more versions of the story of Cinderella with your child before Wednesday, to familiarise them with the plot.
