News from our classrooms

Comets Class

This week Comet Class have continued to show our **Marleigh values** in lots of areas of learning. The children have all been **respectful** of one another, they have been resilient when taking on new challenges and have been reaching high and trying their best in all activities this week.



In **Literacy** this week we read **Lunch on a Pirate Ship**. We discovered that this story had rhyming words in it and so we explored this and found rhyming pairs and even made up our own rhyming words! The children became pirates and made their own pirate ship using large wooden blocks and have been busy working together and mark making on large pieces of paper to make their own treasure maps. They remembered to add features like arrows; to show directions and the all-important X marks the spot. When building and working on their treasure maps the children have been respectful when working together. They have been listening to each other's ideas, building on their ideas and sharing resources. It has been lovely to see what Comet Class can achieve when they work together.

In **Science** we have been learning about the different habitats that animals live in. Some children decided to make a Zoo for the wild animals. They used resources from the construction area and then drew a map of the zoo.



We have been focusing on our writing this week and in **Phonics** the children in Comet Class have shown resilience and have reached high in their independent work. We have been writing sentence using the sounds we learnt (ch and sh). Even when some children found it tricky, they said "I will try my best".





Spitfires Class





We are thrilled to see more sunshine and are excited to be spending more time outdoors, making the most of our outdoor area!

In **PSED** (**Personal**, **Social**, **and Emotional Development**), we've been exploring feelings, tying them to our theme of Growing through stories like Billy's Sunflower. These books help us understand how to manage emotions and identify strategies to calm ourselves when feeling overwhelmed—like using counting techniques. We're also focusing on kindness and discussing ways we can be kind to others, both in and out of the classroom.

In **Phonics**, we've been learning the sounds 'i' and 'e'. The children are making great progress and enjoying discovering new words that start with these sounds. In **Maths**, we are building on our subitising skills—recognizing small groups of objects (1 to 3) without the need to count them. This week, we are formally introducing regular dot patterns, such as those on dice and dominoes, to help the children become more confident in identifying quantities. Thank you for your continued support. It's wonderful to see the children growing and developing each day!

- If you are applying for the working entitlement expanded/extended hours of up to 30 hours funding for the Summer Term, the deadline for this is 31st March 2025.

- As it is sunnier, please apply sunscreen to your child before nursery and send your child with a sun hat.






Blackbirds Class

Blackbirds had a great time during **science day**. They investigated the best material for a bicycle tyre by using **water bottles** and **ramps** to test the speed of different materials wrapped around the bottles. The children made clear and considered **predictions** and carried out their **experiments** effectively. Bubble wrap was found to be the most successful material. They worked well in their teams showing good communication and cooperation.













Hurricanes Class

On Wednesday 19th we had an incredible opportunity to visit **Cambridge Science Park** to explore the fascinating world of sensory science. We engaged in a variety of hands-on workshops designed to help us discover how our senses work and how they shape our understanding of the world. The activities were both engaging and informative, allowing us to conduct experiments and interact with experts in **sensory science**. Some of the activities included:

- Taste and Smell: Understanding how our senses of taste and smell work together, with some surprising results!
- **Touch and Texture**: Experiencing different textures and learning how our sense of touch helps us navigate our environment.
- **Sight and Sound**: Exploring how our brains process sight and sound, and how they impact our perception of the world.


The visit was not only educational but also incredibly fun! It sparked curiosity among the children and provided them with a deeper appreciation for the science behind everyday experiences.

Science Week Competition - Grow a Sunflower! 🌻

As part of our Science Week celebrations exploring the theme of **change**, we launched a **Sunflower Growing Competition** in assembly on Monday. All the children will have come home with some sunflower seeds and some instructions of how to grow their sunflower and how to enter the competition. The details are below. We are really excited to see how the seeds grow and what changes occur! Happy Growing!

How to Enter:

- 1. **Plant Your Sunflower** Follow the instructions to plant a sunflower seed and watch it grow over the next 9 weeks.
- 2. Track the Changes Observe and record how your sunflower grows and changes over time.

Prizes & How to Submit Your Entry:

Tallest Sunflower Prize

- Measure your sunflower at the end of 9 weeks.
- Take a clear photo showing your sunflower with the measurement visible.
- · Submit your photo by the deadline.

Best Poster Prize

- Create a poster (maximum size A3) showing the process of growing your sunflower and the changes that happened.
- Use pictures, drawings, and descriptions to explain what you observed.
- Submit your poster by the deadline.



Every child under the age of five is entitled to free school milk. Simply register your child online.

Every child over the age of five is entitled to milk at a subsidised cost of around £20 per term. Register your child and pay online.

Children in receipt of benefits-based free school meals are eligible for free school milk. Speak to the school for further information.

Free milk for under 5s is funded by the Department of Health and milk for over 5s is subsidised by DEFRA.


