Leaf Detectives at work!

Last week the children examined different leaves in **Science** and practiced identifying a variety of trees. From the jagged edges of oak leaves to the smooth surfaces of birch leaves, the children were keen observers. We also discussed how the shape, size, and colour of leaves help scientists identify tree species.

After reading our class text **Look up! By Nathan Bryon** and learning about meteor showers the children became mini journalists this week and wrote their very own newspaper articles. They described the beauty and wonder of a recent (imaginary) meteor shower, using dramatic headlines, quotes, and vivid descriptions, their writing was truly out of this world.

In **maths**, we explored the concepts of **equal** and **unequal groups** — a foundational step toward understanding multiplication and division. Using counters, blocks, and real-life examples, the children practiced making and identifying equal groups.







Spitfires Class


This week in Nursery, we have been busy exploring the theme of **families**. Many of the children have created their own family trees, which has been a wonderful way for them to share and celebrate their loved ones.

In **Phonics** we have been learning the sounds 'or' and 'oa' and writing them in chalk, in pencil, on the large interactive board and using the whiteboards during phonics. In Maths, we have focused on our unit called 'Show me 5'. The children have been consolidating their understanding by singing lots of fun rhymes, including '5 Little Speckle Frogs' and '5 Little Men in a Flying Saucer'. It's been great to see their enthusiasm for numbers through music and movement!

We have also been learning about caring for our world. After reading the story 'Michael Recycle', the children helped us label the recycling bins in Nursery to encourage sorting rubbish properly. We have even introduced a new food bin to collect snack waste responsibly. We are also so proud of the children for their entries in the Sunflower Competition. Well done to all those who took part. Looking ahead, we are excited for a busy but enjoyable half term as we focus on preparing the children for their next steps and transition in their educational journey.

Apply for up to £250 to pay for after school activity clubs

The Grassroots Activity Grant helps children to access sport, dance, physical activity sessions and swimming lessons. The grant provides up to £250 per year to pay for joining fees and weekly session fees. It is kindly funded by the Leys School.

Grants are for children aged 4-16 years old and families must be in receipt of Universal Credit or Income Support to be eligible.
