News from our classrooms

Vulcan Class


This week, Vulcan Class have been busy exploring the world around them through hands-on, active learning.

In **maths**, we investigated **capacity** and **volume** by estimating and then measuring how much different containers could hold. There was lots of fun—and a few splashes!—as we carefully poured water to test our predictions. We discovered that some containers, even if they look big, don't always hold as much as we expected!

In **geography**, we became **fieldwork explorers**. First, we ventured into the forest to identify trees by closely examining their **twigs and buds**. Then, we used magnifying glasses to investigate an area of grass, spotting a variety of tiny plants and creatures. It was fascinating to see just how much life exists in such a small space!







It's been a fantastic week of discovery, and we are looking forward to even more exciting learning next week before the Easter break.

Comet Class

This week in Comet Class we have been using our **5 senses**. We have had the chance to feel, touch, smell and listen to different things around us. The children enjoyed **smelling** different scents like **coffee**, **nutmeg**, **ginger** and **flowers**. This sparked lots of conversations about the smells we liked and the smells we didn't like. Coffee beans were not a popular smell!

The children also explored and investigated **ice**. We got to feel lots of ice, listen to the noises it made when it was in a bowl, and we looked carefully to see if we noticed any changes happening. After we had practiced using our senses inside the classroom, we then went on a sensory walk and continued outside. The children went through the forest area, and sat near the pond and we spent time looking, listening, feeling and smelling the nature all around us. We all enjoyed this calming activity.



Comet Class have been doing lots of **outdoor learning** recently. This week we have also made **journey sticks**. The children explored outside and looked for natural or interesting objects. We then attached the objects to the sticks using string and used positional language to describe where we found the objects. The sticks looked fantastic!

We have also been learning about **Easter**, and how different families around the world celebrate this in different ways. We have been so proud of Comet Class for being respectful during these interesting conversations. The children have listened to each other, paid attention and taken turns to talk. They have also asked some interesting and thought-provoking questions. They have got creative using **paints** and **pastels** and have started to make cards for their family and friends.

A very busy week for the children in Reception and we are so proud of them all for showing such a positive attitude towards their learning. We have had a lot of fun. Fingers crossed for more sunshine!







Hercules Class

- ✓ Science We explored circuits and switches, learning how electricity flows and how we can control it. The students had great fun experimenting with different components to see how circuits can be opened and closed!
- **Geography** Our writing skills were put to the test as we crafted letters about the **Mojave Desert**. We thought about what it would be like to live there and described the unique landscape, climate, and wildlife. The creativity and detail in these letters were amazing!
- ► Maths We have now moved on to learning about angles in our shape unit. The class has been identifying and measuring different angles, and we've even started exploring how angles appear in everyday life.

It's been a great week full of **discovery**, **creativity**, and **problem-solving**! We look forward to another exciting week ahead.




