Hercules



We're happy to be back in school this week after a restful half term break - the children were excited to share what they did during their time off. This half term we have lots in store in Upper Key Stage Two, including swimming during our P.E lessons.

Hercules Class were extremely excited to go swimming for the first time this week. The children made their way to Fen Ditton on foot before boarding the coach to Abbey Leisure Centre. They practised some skills and were placed in different groups based on their confidence and ability. Mr Parker was very impressed with the children's effort and we look forward to seeing how they progress as the weeks go by.





Spitfires



We have had a 'sparkling' start to the new half term in the Spitfires Class, with children lots of children returning to nursery keen to share their experiences of fireworks. We watched a firework display on our screen and enjoyed talking what we could see and hear...whoosh, bang, wheee!

We then explored how a firework might move and had fun curling up small and then jumping up high with a loud bang. In our creative workshop area, we have worked together to create a huge collaborative piece of artwork.

We began by using our hands or brushes to paint fireworks expressively, then used the skill of 'printing' to add stars, before learning how to shake glitter onto the paint and blow off the excess. It has been lovely to see so many children getting involved and working together. Well done Spitfires!

Vulcans



At the end of the first half term, the children in Vulcan Class completed their first art unit investigating the beauty of flowers. We thought about how we can use different colours to show emotions and looked at the artwork of many famous artists such as Claude Monet, Vincent Van Gough, Marc Quinn and finally, Georgia O'Keeffe.

We were inspired by the simple shapes that O'Keefe used to make our own flowers. We drew sketches of different flowers, just like O'Keeffe did as a child, before turning our sketches into fabric flowers. We dyed our own fabric using a dip-dying technique which was lots of (messy!) fun.

Then, we cut out the flowers and joined them by sewing a button on. We shared our flowers with the class and we were all impressed by everyone's hard work. Nathan said, "I liked doing the dip dying because it was fun." Yagmur said, "I liked making the flowers with the different colours." Aun said, "My favourite painter was Monet. I liked the long painting of the waterlilies and the lesson when we did sewing." Evie said, "I liked sewing the buttons on."



What You Need to Know About Encouraging Respect
