Our Year 5 children start their swimming lessons next Wednesday and we are looking forward to guiding them through the 12 weeks of opportunity to develop this crucial life skill.

News from our classrooms

Caterpillars Class

Dragonflies Class

Dragonfly Class have made a great start to Year 2. In **English**, we have begun our work on The Colour Monster, which is helping us to think about different feelings at the start of a new school year.

In **History**, we have been learning about how schools have changed over time and comparing them to our own experiences today. It has been a positive start to the year, and we are looking forward to the term ahead.

Our classroom has been filled with energy and enthusiasm, and it has been lovely getting to know the children and taking time to lay the foundations for a positive and productive year ahead. Badgers Class

What a busy and exciting week we've had in Badgers! In **English**, we've been inspired by the beautiful words and illustrations in *The Lost Words* by Robert Macfarlane and Jackie Morris. We've explored how nature can come alive through poetry and have begun experimenting with our own descriptive language.

In **Guided Reading**, we've been absolutely captivated by *Skellig* - so much so that it has become our end-of-day Reading for Pleasure book. The whole class is gripped, and we can't wait to uncover more of the mystery as the story unfolds! In **Maths**, we've challenged ourselves with place value, learning how to read and write numbers up to 10,000,000. It's been tricky at times, but Badgers have shown brilliant perseverance and accuracy.

In **History**, we stepped back in time to the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. Working in small groups, we created timelines of key events and discussed how these two groups helped shape Britain. In **Computing** with Mrs Nicholls, the classroom was filled with laughter as we explored Scratch to create music. There were some very unusual (and very funny!) sound effects echoing through Year 6! It's been a week full of creativity, curiosity, and collaboration - well done, Badgers!









Home Learning - Autumn term update

This year, we're excited to launch a refreshed approach to home learning that encourages creativity, independence, and deeper engagement with the curriculum.

Each half term, children will receive a **Home Learning Menu** – a selection of open-ended tasks linked to their current learning in school. These tasks are designed to be flexible and creative, allowing children to respond in a way that suits their interests and strengths. They may choose to create models, write stories, produce artwork, or carry out research – the possibilities are wide-ranging and purposeful.

The aim is to develop key skills such as **self-study**, **time management**, **and presentation of knowledge**, while also making home learning enjoyable and meaningful.

Children can choose the order in which they complete the tasks over the half term. The menu for this half term is:

- Stuck into your child's Home Learning Book, which will come home on Monday
- Available on the school website under Parents > Home Learning

In addition to the creative tasks, we have clear expectations for English and Maths home learning across the school. Please see the table on the next page for guidance:

Reading is at the heart of everything we do, and having more adults available to hear children read makes a real difference to their confidence, fluency, and enjoyment.


- No need to book in advance just turn up on the day if you're free.

Drop off and pick up

We open both gates (nearest the park and ride and those nearest the office) to allow children to enter and exit from two points at drop off and pick up to support the management of foot traffic. Children will continue to be dismissed from their classroom doors unless we have written permission that they can travel home independently.

We would suggest that the youngest children (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) come through the gate by the Park and Ride and the older children come through the office gate entrance but this isn't fixed and we are happy for either entrance to be used by families.
