Headteacher's insight

As we move into the final two weeks of this half term, I'd like to take a moment to reflect on recent highlights and share some important updates from across our school community.

Firstly, a heartfelt thank you to everyone who supported our Book Fair. Your enthusiasm and purchases have helped us generate valuable funds that will be used to purchase new books for both our library and classrooms. We're excited to continue building a rich and diverse reading culture at Marleigh, and your support plays a key role in making that possible.

Over the past few weeks, we've had the pleasure of welcoming several prospective families for tours of the school. It's been wonderful to share the energy and warmth of our learning environment with new visitors.

Looking ahead to September 2026, we will be welcoming one Reception class of 30 children, and we're already seeing strong interest in places. A number of our current classes are now full, and we are operating waiting lists in some year groups however the year group sizes are not even so we have spaces in others. If you know of local families who may be considering school options, we would be grateful for your promotion of Marleigh—being full is not only a reflection of our growing reputation, but also brings wider benefits to our school community.

We also have spaces available in our Nursery, which now offers extended hours in partnership with Premier from 7:45am to 6:00pm. This flexible provision is designed to support working families and provide a nurturing, play-based environment for our youngest learners. If you know of families who may be interested, please do encourage them to get in touch.

Next week, we will be celebrating **Harvest** in school. As part of this, we are inviting families to contribute to a donation drive for Abbey People Food Hub, which supports local families in need. We are collecting tinned, canned and dry goods, and a collection station will be set up in the school entrance all week. We warmly encourage families to send in donations to be added to our collective contribution—thank you in advance for your generosity and community spirit.

In the final week of this half term, Marleigh will be participating in a pilot Ofsted inspection. This is part of Ofsted's internal training programme as they prepare to roll out a new inspection framework. We're sharing this with you for awareness only.

Finally, I'd like to celebrate the children's creative responses to home learning this half term. Their engagement with the activity menu has been thoughtful and imaginative, and it's been a pleasure to see how they've interpreted tasks in their own unique ways. Thank you to all parents and carers for supporting this learning at home—it really does make a difference.

Thank you, as always, for your continued support and partnership. Marleigh is growing into a vibrant and nurturing school community, and it's a privilege to lead it forward with you.

News from our classrooms

Caterpillars Class

This week, we've had a wonderfully vibrant and engaging time in nursery, with lots of exciting activities and learning opportunities!

We introduced the children to the colourful and joyful celebration of Diwali, the Festival of Lights. The children particularly enjoyed creating Mendhi hand designs, experimenting with patterns and shapes to decorate paper hands. They also made their own Diya lamps.

As part of our learning this week about 'People Who Help Us', we had a very special visitor this week – one of our lovely nursery mums, who is a doctor, came in to talk to the children about her important job. The children were fascinated as she showed them how to apply dressings and talked about how doctors help people stay healthy. Thank you so much for your time.

Our home corner has also been buzzing with activity, with lots of children dressing up and role-playing as doctors, nurses, firefighters, and more. It's been wonderful to see their imaginations and confidence grow as they explore these real-life roles. Last week, we explored the sound "b" as in bat, and this week we're learning "n" as in net. The children are becoming more confident in recognising letter sounds and are starting to use them in their play and early mark-making. In Maths we have been learning about patterns.

To develop fine motor skills, the children enjoyed using tweezers to collect autumnal treasures like conkers and leaves. This activity helped strengthen their hand muscles while also encouraging focus, coordination, and perseverance – all important for early writing and self-care skills.

Reminders and useful information:

- Snack Time: Please send only one snack per session (morning or afternoon). Snack is an important part of our routine, but we limit it to 30 minutes to ensure children have time to enjoy all areas of learning. We've noticed that some children are spending longer at the snack table, so keeping snacks simple and limited helps us manage this time more effectively.
- Fruit Safety: For safety reasons, we kindly ask that all fruit and vegetables be sliced, including small fruits like grapes and strawberries, as these can pose a choking hazard. Alternatively, you are welcome to provide a different safe and healthy snack.
- Toys from Home: While we understand children may want to bring toys from home, we kindly ask that these be kept at home. We have a wide range of resources in nursery, and personal toys can sometimes lead to upset around sharing or misplacement.

Thank you for your understanding and support in helping us create a calm, safe, and inclusive environment for all our children.







Ladybirds Class

This week, Ladybirds Class have been busy exploring new ideas across our subjects. We have been on a journey through sentence building, number work, and living history.

In **English**, we've been exploring the structure of sentences—learning how nouns, verbs, and adjectives work together to build meaning. Our writing has grown from being inspired by *The Highway Rat* to our new focus text, *The Bear and the Piano*. We're now looking forward to using our sentence skills to create a setting description.

In **Maths**, we've started our journey into addition. The children have been introduced to part-whole models, helping them understand how parts come together to make a whole. We are now writing simple addition number sentences, building confidence and fluency.

In **History**, we had a very special visitor! Mrs Biggs, a Marleigh resident, joined us to share memories of her childhood in the 1940s. The children were captivated by her stories—learning that children played with dolls and bikes, televisions were rare, and school uniforms weren't worn until age 11. Her visit helped us understand how childhood has changed over the last 80 years, and the children asked thoughtful questions throughout. Well done Ladybirds!

Squirrels Class

It has been a busy week for Squirrels Class! On Wednesday, the children in Year 4 went to **Stapleford Granary** for a morning of immersive music and dance experiences, linked to **The Tin Forest** story by Helen Ward.

Then in the afternoon, all of Lower Key Stage 2 walked to Fen Ditton Primary School for an afternoon of golf-related games, which linked to the golf unit they have been learning in PE. It was great to see the children persevering with the putting and chipping skills and enjoying themselves with the different activities.

We also enjoyed our science lesson this week which involved experimenting with different materials and investigating the types of shadows they made. We used our knowledge of transparent, translucent and opaque materials and learnt that shadows are made when an object blocks the light.









Badgers Class

It's been another busy and exciting week in Year 6! In **Science**, we carried out a three-part experiment investigating how temperature affects how quickly sugar cubes dissolve. We tested cold, warm, and hot water, made careful observations, and discussed why temperature makes such a big difference to the rate of dissolving.

In **English**, we've been exploring **information texts**. Using our research skills, we gathered fascinating facts about **kingfishers**, **herons**, **and foxes**, focusing on how to organise information clearly and write in an engaging, factual style.

In **PE**, we've continued developing our football skills, focusing on attacking play and using small, controlled steps to keep the ball away from defenders. In History, we examined the impact of Viking invasions on British settlements, thinking about how these invasions changed communities and culture across the country.

And to top it all off, on Wednesday afternoon we visited **Fen Ditton** for a Year 6 activity with Mrs Dennett-Jones. We had great fun working in teams to build creative structures using just straws and Blu Tack. It was a brilliant challenge for our problem-solving and teamwork skills! Well done, Badgers, for another fantastic week of curiosity, collaboration, and creativity.


