Ladybirds Class

We've had such a fun and busy week in Ladybirds. In **Maths**, we've been learning about number bonds. We've used cubes, counters and tens frames to help us find all the different ways to make numbers up to 10. Some of us can even remember them off by heart now.

In **English**, we've been writing setting descriptions. We used our senses and lots of adjectives to describe what we could see and hear. Our writing is really starting to paint a picture for the reader.

On **Wednesday**, we had a team-building sports afternoon, where we played games that helped us practise working together with Dragonflies Class and our friends from Fen Ditton. We loved cheering for our friends and celebrating everyone's efforts.

On **STEM Day**, we explored all four STEM subjects – Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. We worked together to investigate, build and test our ideas for bridges and launching "rocket mice." We used programming to walk through a maze and investigated shapes. We also took part in an online safety workshop. It was great fun being scientists and engineers for the day!

In RE, we used art to explore the idea of 'Creation'. We thought about how people show their ideas and beliefs through artwork and enjoyed creating our own masterpieces.

And don't forget – our trip is on Tuesday 4th November which is the first day of term. Please make sure <u>permission forms</u> are in and that we're all ready for an exciting day out.

Badgers Class

What an exciting and inspiring week we've had in Year 6! We rounded off our **History** unit by creating beautifully presented **double-page spreads** all about the **Vikings**. The children showcased everything they've learned about Viking life, trade, and invasions through detailed writing and illustrations – a wonderful way to conclude our topic!

In **English**, we stepped into the world of Skellig once again, writing diary entries from the perspectives of **Michael or Mina**. The children captured the characters' emotions and voices brilliantly, showing real empathy and imagination in their writing.

The highlight of the week was undoubtedly our **STEM trip to Qualcomm!** We took part in interactive workshops and tours, learning all about the amazing technology behind everyday devices. We had a go at coding on **Micro:bits**, playing games like *Rock*, *Paper, Scissors* and *Chuck-a-Duck*. We were fascinated to see a robotic arm being programmed to test headphones, and even stepped inside an **anechoic chamber** to experience total sound isolation. We also discovered the intricate **hardware that powers microchips** in products such as smartphones, sat navs, and more.

It was an incredible experience that really brought Science, Technology and Engineering to life. Well done, Badgers, for your curiosity, teamwork, and enthusiasm throughout the week!




