Butterflies Class

This week in Butterflies, we have been learning all about animal habitats. The children enjoyed sorting a range of animals into where they live — the desert, polar regions, woodland, or the sea — and are beginning to talk about why each habitat is suitable for different animals.

In maths, we have been recognising and identifying different representations of the numbers 4 and 5. The children are growing in confidence when explaining how they know a group shows these numbers.

In PSHE, the children loved sharing their family photos with the class. We talked about the special people in our lives and why they are important to us.

In phonics this week, we have been learning all about the sound's 'u' and 'r'. The children have enjoyed practising these sounds and applying their growing phonics knowledge in their phonics books.

On Wednesday afternoon, the children enjoyed a visit from their Year 6 buddies. The Year 6 pupils listened to Reception read their reading books and joined in with their independent play. It was a lovely opportunity for the children to build confidence and share their learning.

We have also been busy practising songs for our class nativity which will be held on Monday 8th December. A letter will be coming home shortly to let you know what part your child has in the performance.





Dragonflies Class


This week in Dragonflies we've enjoyed lots of hands-on learning. We made our own wormery in science, which the children loved observing and talking about. Maths has taken us into shapes and symmetry, where we've been spotting patterns and identifying different shapes.


Our geography work led us to the polar regions as we explored what these icy places are really like. In PSHE we had a very active session, thinking about how our bodies feel when we're moving and exercising.

We've also begun rehearsals for our school Christmas show, and the children are already very excited. It's been another lovely week in the classroom.









Owls Class

We had busy week of learning in Owls Class! In DT, we began by exploring different types of structures inspired by real-life pavilions. Working in teams, the children experimented with modelling dough and toothpicks to design and build their own mini structures.

In science, we learned about the important bones that support our bodies, including the cranium, mandible and femur. We even investigated the classroom to measure different "bones" and discovered which were the longest and shortest.

Another highlight of our week was our class assembly—Owls Class were incredibly proud of their performance, and it was wonderful to see so many parents in the audience supporting them.
