Happy New Year and welcome back to the Spring term at Marleigh Primary Academy. It has been a genuine pleasure to see the children return this week so positively, ready to learn and reconnect. After any break – and especially after the Christmas holidays – we are very intentional in how we support pupils back into school life. Staff have prioritised the 3Rs: relationships, routines and resilience, ensuring that every child feels secure, supported and ready to thrive as the new term begins.

As we start January, it also feels right to reflect on what was a wonderfully busy and joyful end to the Autumn term. The PTFA Christmas Fayre was a fantastic community event, and we are very grateful for the time, energy and generosity that made it such a success. A Highlight From Our Week

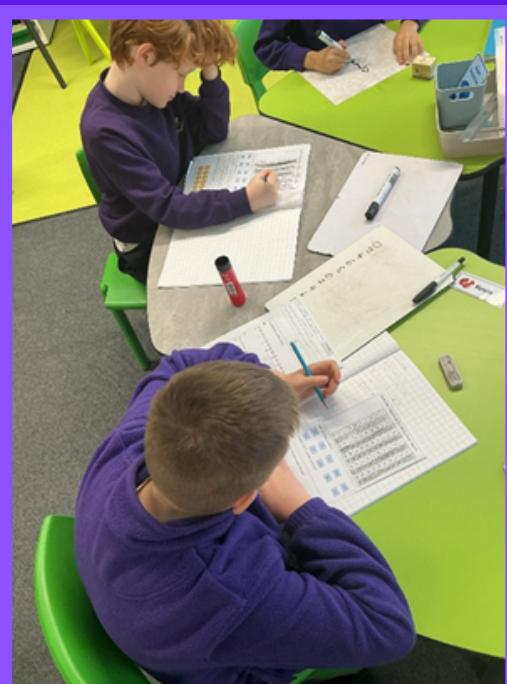
A highlight from our first week back was our first gymnastics lesson. We really enjoyed learning how to make our bodies still and strong in different positions, both on and off the apparatus.

Something We Learned This Week

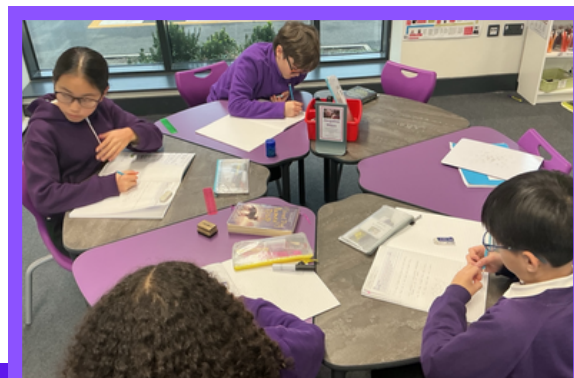

A Highlight From Our Week

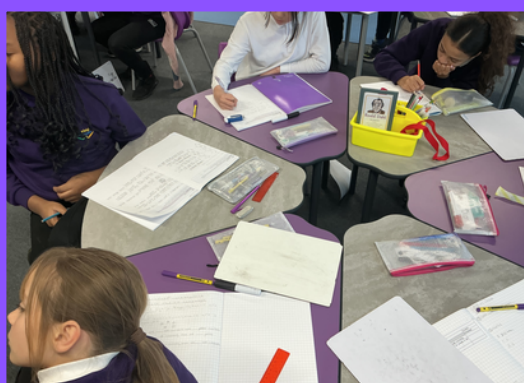
In Gymnastics with Mr Parker we explored the different gymnastics positions, such as pike and tucks, and experimented with different methods of travel between movement.

In maths this week, we have been learning about ratio and how to describe the additive or multiplicative relationship between two values.

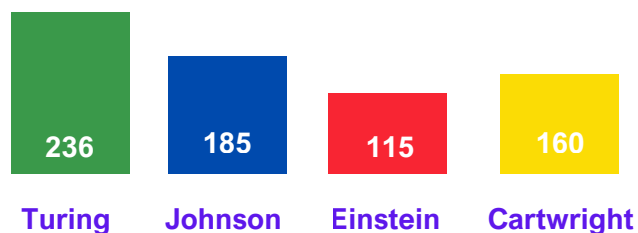
Class Book Update

Big Garden Bird Watch

Join Us for the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch!

We're excited to announce that we are taking part in the RSPB Big Schools' Birdwatch 2026, running from 6 January to 13 February! This is a nationwide activity where thousands of schools survey the birds visiting their school grounds, helping the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB) understand more about bird life in the UK.



What will we be doing?

Each class will choose some time to go outside and observe the birds in our playground and outdoor spaces. Pupils will identify and count the birds they see, then we will submit these results online to the RSPB — even “zero” sightings matter!

This activity supports real scientific research into birds and biodiversity while encouraging children to get outdoors and connect with nature.

How can families join in?

You're welcome to take part at home too! Simply choose an hour over the weekend of the 23rd to the 26th January to watch the birds in your garden, local park or from your window, and record what you see. It's a fun way to explore wildlife together and contribute to a national project!

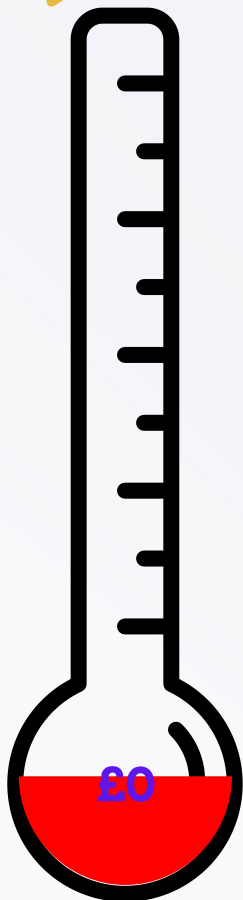
