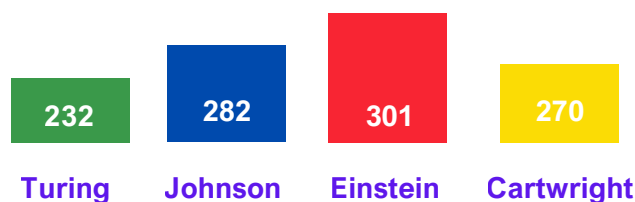

Thank you for your continued support. We have had such a positive week, and we look forward to sharing more learning with you.

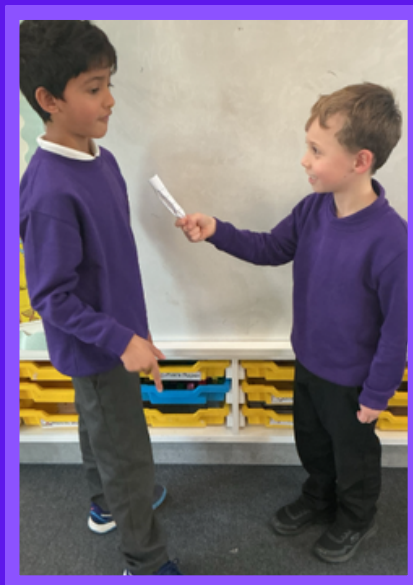




Dragonflies Class

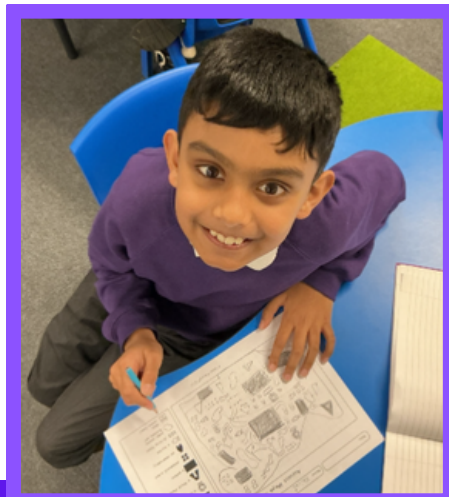

Owls Class



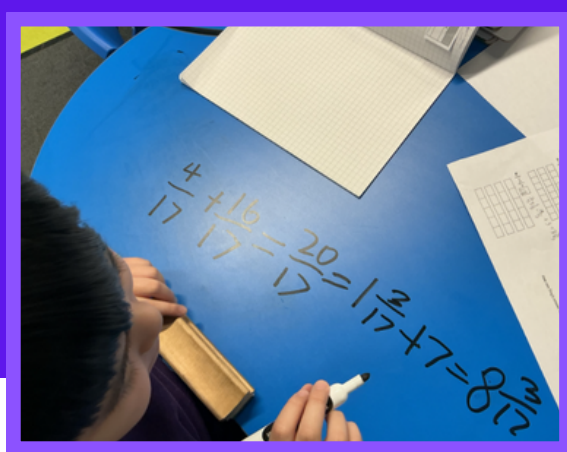
Another busy week has flown by in our classrooms, here's what the Owls have been up to:

In maths, we are becoming more fluent in solving addition and subtraction fractions with different denominators - including mixed fractions. There are lots of steps to remember but the Owls have been focused and resilient. We even wrote on our tables to show and check our workings.

In English, we had an online workshop led by the Alim Kamara who is a rapper/author for National Storytelling Week 2026. He showed us how rap stands for 'rhythm and poetry' and we even had a go at making our own raps about what superpower we would like. The Owls were very creative with their rhymes, rhyming 'flexibility' with 'invisibility'

In History, we became archaeologist for a day and planned our own Maya civilisation city complete with features discovered in Ancient Maya ruins. Some of us placed lots of markets others drew rivers to help with trade. We discussed what was challenging about organising our own city and a few pupils presented their maps to the whole class.
