CHALLENGE ONE

English - The Day the Crayons Quit

Choose an object at home (toy, food, jumper, pencil etc.).

Tell someone why it is the BEST and they should choose it.

You can:

- say your reasons aloud
- draw and label your reasons

CHALLENGE TWO

PE - Dance: Mood Dance

Put on some music and create movements for different moods.

Can you show:

- happy
- sad
- excited
- sleepy

Perform your dance for someone at home.

CHALLENGE THREE

DT - Making Smoothies: Smoothie Designer

Invent your own smoothie.

You can:

- draw the ingredients
- give your smoothie a name

As an extra challenge, you could make your smoothie with your grown-up. Did you like the flavour?

CHALLENGE FOUR

Science - Animals: Comparing Animals

Choose **ONE** activity.

Animal grouping game

Sort toy animals or pictures into groups (for example pets, wild animals, animals that fly, animals that swim).

OR

Animal detective

Choose an animal.

Draw and label its body parts (fur, wings, scales etc.).

CHALLENGE FIVE

Geography - What is the weather like in the UK?

Choose **ONE** activity.

How do you dress for the weather?

Draw what you would wear in summer and winter.

OR

Season walk

Go outside and spot signs of the current season. How is it different to Autumn? Draw a picture and use some words to compare the current season with the other seasons you know about.

CHALLENGE SIX

RE - Why should we care for the world?

Choose **ONE** activity.

- Do one helpful job to care for the world (recycling, watering plants, picking up litter).
- Draw something in nature you want to protect.
- Draw or explain how we can help animals or plants.

CHALLENGE SEVEN

PSHE - Citizenship

Family rules

What rules do you have at home?

Why are they important?

Draw or write a poster showing your rules. You could include bedtime, when must you brush your teeth, when do you do your reading?

CHALLENGE EIGHT

Music – Sound Patterns & Rhythm

Make music using household or kitchen objects. Can you play a tune you know?

Play sounds loudly and softly.

CHALLENGE NINE

Computing – programming Bee Bots

Robot Helper

Pretend someone at home is a robot.

Give them step-by-step instructions to:

- walk to the kitchen
- pick up a toy
- sit on a chair
